STEPS TO INCLUSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

There is an economic and moral imperative to the pursuit of inclusive growth. Evidence tells us that inequalities negatively impact economic growth prospects, demonstrated by decreased attainment of education and training, poorer health outcomes and social dislocations that carry increased costs and burdens.

We need all who want to participate in their economies to be able to do so. No one group or community has solved the problem, and no one solution is appropriate for all communities. Together —businesses, institutions and governments—need the creativity, perspective, and economic input of all to prosper.

- Take the time to be curious and develop an understanding of Indigenous ways of knowing and being
- Develop a framework for strengthened partnerships between your organization and Indigenous governments for community economic development and well-being
- Build local relationships with First Nations to support indigenous economies and economic development opportunities
- Use traditional indigenous economic principles to work towards sustainable, effective, and comprehensive community economic development



CELEBRATION IDEAS FOR #EconDevWeek

List and promote via social, digital and local media the **Top 10 Reasons why your community, First Nation or region is GREAT!** Host a Photo or Video Contest and ask residents to share what they appreciate most.

Ask to serve as a **GUEST BLOGGER** during Economic Development Week and author a blog post. Topic examples include new projects, awards and recognitions, and program updates.

NEWSLETTER: Convey the importance of Economic Development Week and what it represents within your organization's regular communications or newsletter. Create an editorial calendar and include a series of articles to feature in your newsletter to build up anticipation.

Celebrate small to medium size businesses. SMEs aren't just crucial drivers of the Canada economy; they are at the heart of all of our communities. Give back to local businesses; say thank you.

Make May 8 to 12 a week for local leaders and staff to talk to local businesses. Set up a socially distanced **Business Walk** initiative and ask your local businesses key questions on the state of their business, the local economy and how you can assist them to maintain during these challenging times. Contact SEDA for a Business Walk Resource Guide.

Engage in Action Planning. Break down that official or comprehensive plan into bite size action plans and mobilize for the future of your community.

Reach out to your neighbouring communities and First Nations. Build a foundation or enhance a relationship that has already started. Start working together on small projects. #InclusiveEcDev
